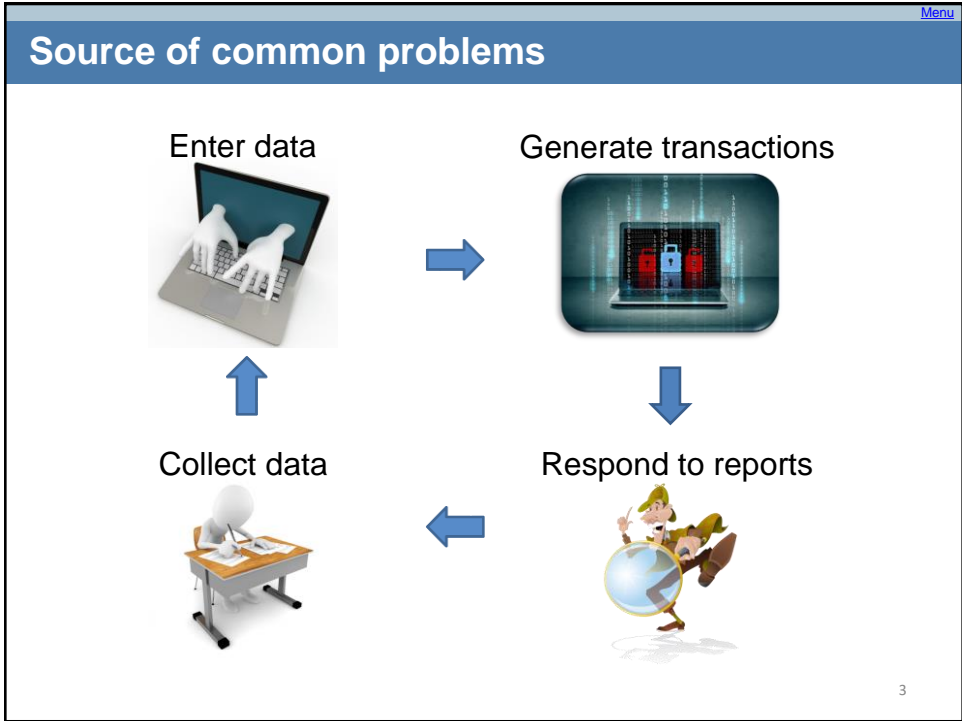

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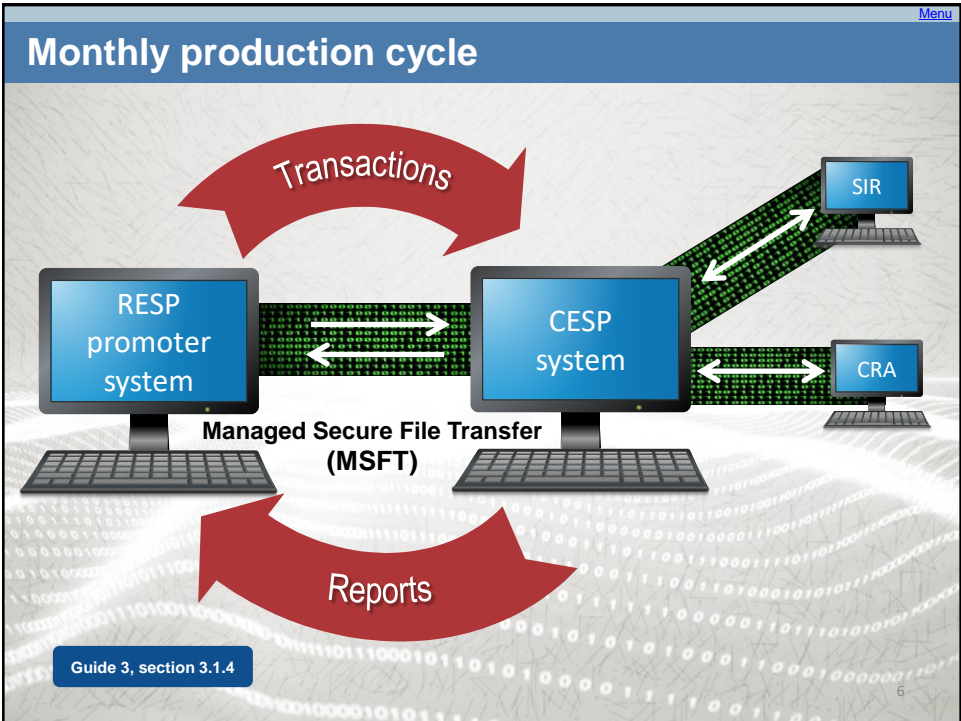

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CESP system reports reference sheet

CESP Reports	RT	Description
Transaction error report (.err)	800	Reports transactions containing errors and provides corresponding error codes. Rejected transactions must be corrected by the promoter and resubmitted to the CESP system.
Severe error report (.ser)	850	Reports transaction error types which cannot have regular error messages. Rejected transactions must be corrected by the promoter and resubmitted to the CESP system.
Transaction processing report (.pro)	002	Supplies reporting period information and indicates the net amount of incentives that will be paid to the promoter for all beneficiaries throughout the reporting period, after subtracting repayment amounts and taking reversed transactions into consideration.
	003	Identifies the promoter file processed by the CESP system. Each file processed in the reporting period generates a corresponding RT 003 record.
	900	Acknowledges the successful processing of each RT 100, RT 200, RT 400 and RT 511 transaction. These records also provide information required to update RESP notional accounts and may include refusal reasons for the Basic CESP, the Additional CESP and the CLB.
	911	Acknowledges the successful processing of each RT 411 transaction and each RT 400 transaction that includes BCTESG amounts greater than zero. These records also provide information required to update the BCTESG notional accounts and may include refusal reasons for the BCTESG.
SIN validation report (.svr)	920	Identifies beneficiaries who have already been successfully validated by the CESP system, but have since been flagged with Social Insurance Number (SIN) issues. Promoters are responsible for reviewing these reports and resolving these issues.
Contract registration report (.reg)	950	Reports the status of non-financial transactions required for contract registration. The CESP system sends contract information to the CRA for registration only if the CESP system validation of these transactions indicates that a contract would be eligible for registration by the CRA.
Referral report (.ref)	960	Reports referral transactions to RESP promoters participating in the Education Savings Referral Service that are received by the CESP system from Service Ontario.

The Canada Education Savings Program (CESP) with Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) is intended to encourage the delivery of post-secondary education through the following:

- Canada Education Savings Grant (CESG)
- Canada Education Savings Incentive (CESI)
- Canada Learning Assistance Grant (CLAG)
- Student Loans Program (SLP)
- Student Financial Assistance (SFA)

This appendix explains the refusal reasons (RR) related to approval or denial requests for these education savings programs. The appendix C has the application and forms used in this guide.

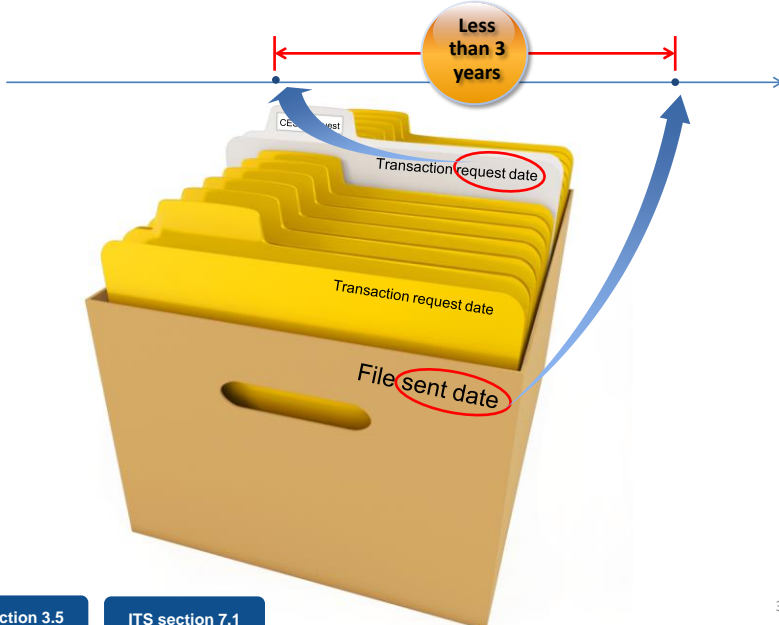

 - Nicknames v names, first and last name reversed, day/month reversed in birth year
- **Privacy issues for the custodial parent**
- **One-name beneficiary**

- ✘ **Consequences of a rejected 200-03 transaction:**
 - **Error codes (7001 or 7031)**
 - All financial transactions related to that SIN

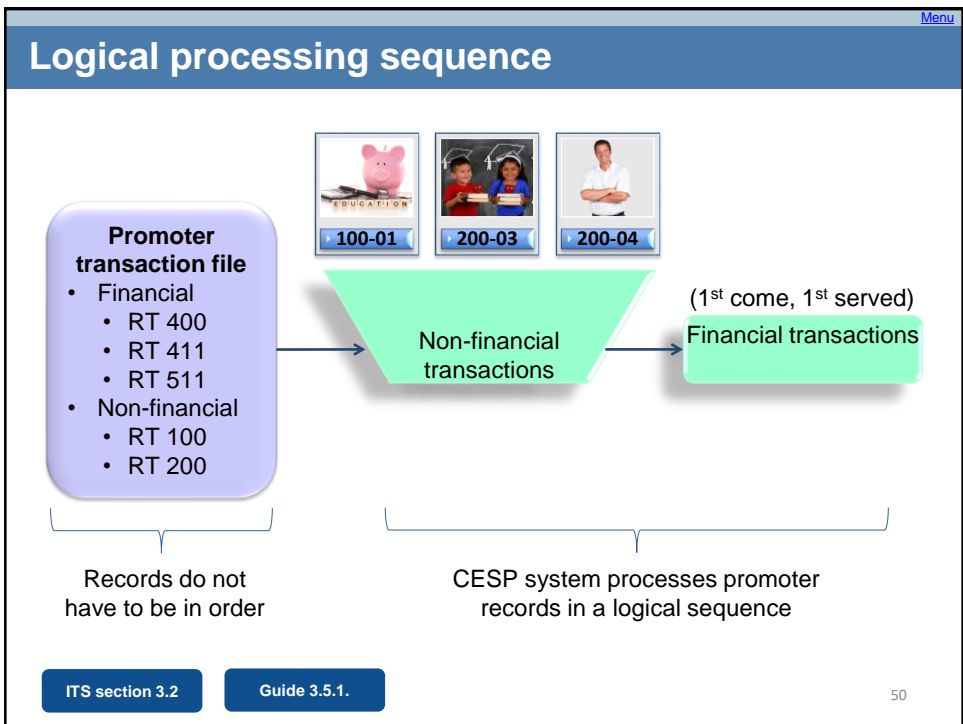

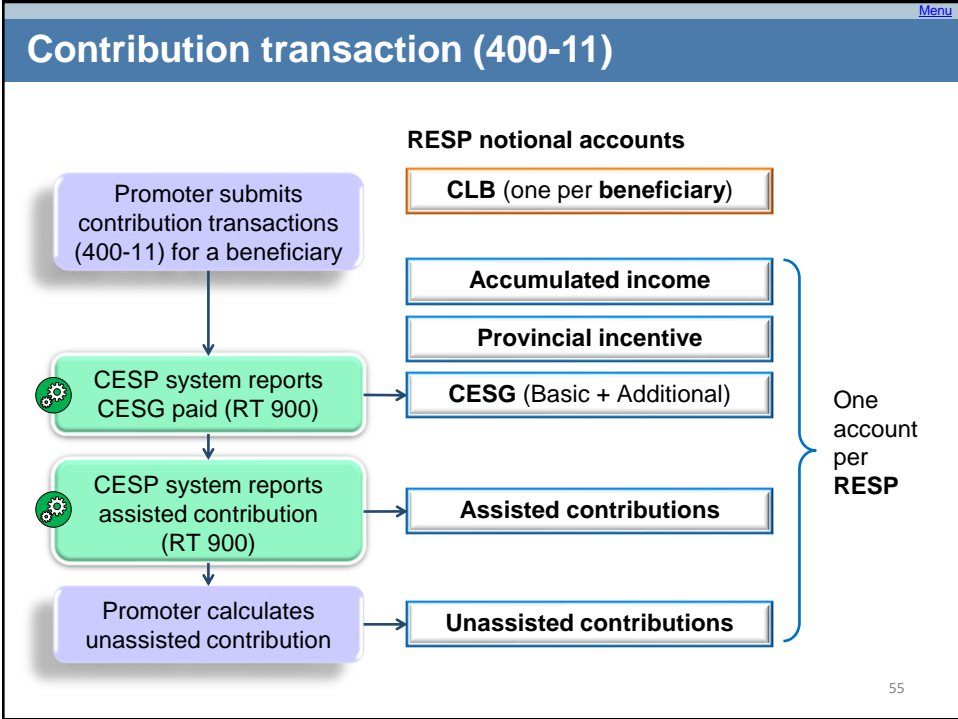

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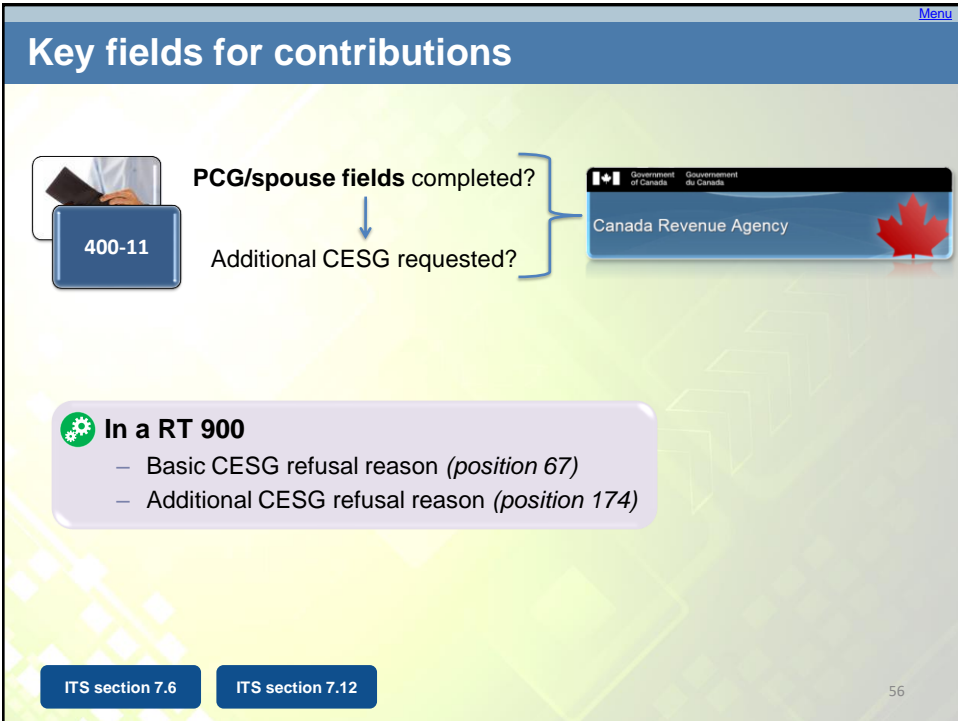

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Common problems with a 400-11 transaction

Error codes 7001 and 7031

- Beneficiary not established in the system or not associated with the specimen plan ID of the financial transaction

Refusal reason L (PCG/spouse SIN or agency BN not matched by the CRA)

- Prior to 2018: wrong PCG, or PCG not established at the CRA
- Since 2018: wrong PCG, cohabiting spouse or common-law partner or, not established at the CRA

Refusal reason J (Additional CESG)

- Contract is not an individual/sibling only
 - field reported inaccurately as “0” or blank in the 100-01 transaction
 - the CESP system assumes there are cousins in this plan

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Incentive repayment transaction (400-21)



- Identify the reason
- Determine the repayment amounts
- Submit the repayment transaction(s)


CESP system deducts repayment amounts from monthly incentive payments.

Guide Appendix G ITS section 7.6 77

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Twelve repayment reasons




Code - Description	Examples
01 - Contribution withdrawal	Promoters must calculate the amount of CESG to repay if contributions are withdrawn when no beneficiary in the RESP is eligible for an EAP.
02 - AIP	Repay all incentives when a subscriber receives an accumulated income payment (AIP) from the RESP.
03 - Contract termination	Repay all incentives (if applicable) and inform the CESP system that an RESP has been terminated. The transaction is mandatory when RESPs are terminated.
04 - Ineligible transfer	Repay all incentives when an ineligible transfer occurs.
05 - Ineligible beneficiary replacement	Repay all incentives when an ineligible replacement of a beneficiary occurs.
06 - Payment to educational institution	Repay all incentives if the subscriber pays accumulated earnings to a Canadian designated educational institution instead of taking an accumulated income payment.
07 - Revocation	Repay all incentives when the CRA revokes the registration of an RESP.
08 - Ceases to meet sibling only condition	Repay incentives, which can only be paid into a sibling only RESP, when a subscriber adds a cousin to a sibling only family RESP.
09 - Deceased	Repay incentives when a beneficiary dies. With the exception of CLB, incentives paid for a deceased beneficiary might be used instead by other beneficiaries in the same RESP, or transferred to another RESP.
10 - Overcontribution withdrawal	Repay the CESG amount if contributions were withdrawn to correct an overcontribution. If the amount of overcontribution is \$4,000 or less at the time of the withdrawal, the CESG amount to repay is zero. However, a repayment transaction (400-21) must still be submitted to the CESP.
11 - Other	Promoter support officers may instruct promoters to use this reason in various situations.
12 - Non-resident	Repay incentive amounts if it is determined that the beneficiary did not satisfy required residency criteria to be eligible for incentive payments.

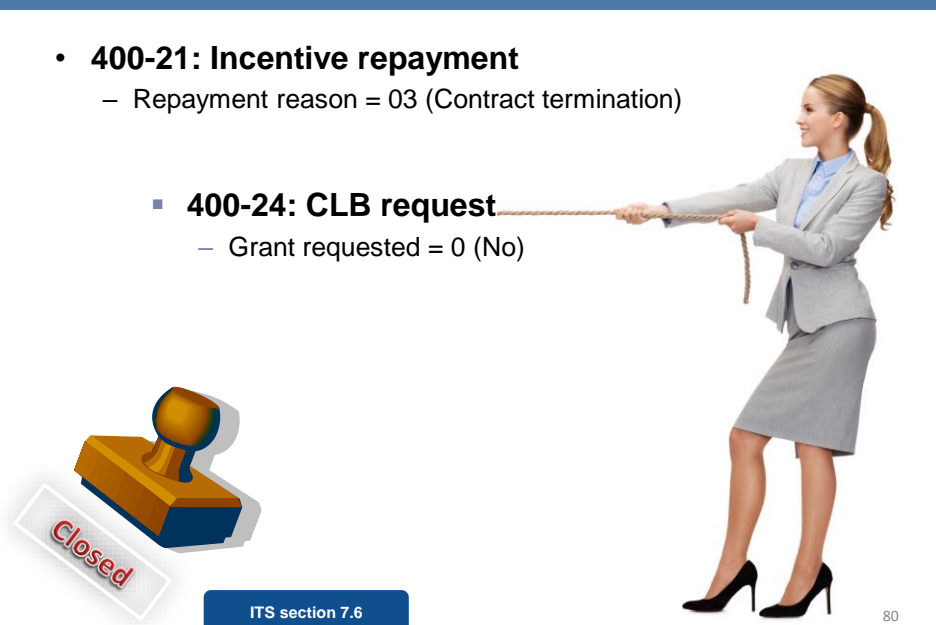

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Common problems with a 400-21 transaction

- ✘ Error code 7036**
 - Must be zero or blank if repayment reason is 01
 - CLB amount and BCTESG
- Promoters do not notify the CESP about terminations**
 - Submit a 400-21 (reason 03)
 - Even if repayment amounts are zero
- Using reversals instead of repayments**
 - Reversals are for administrative errors only
- Using repayments instead of reversals**
 - Repayments do not restore grant room

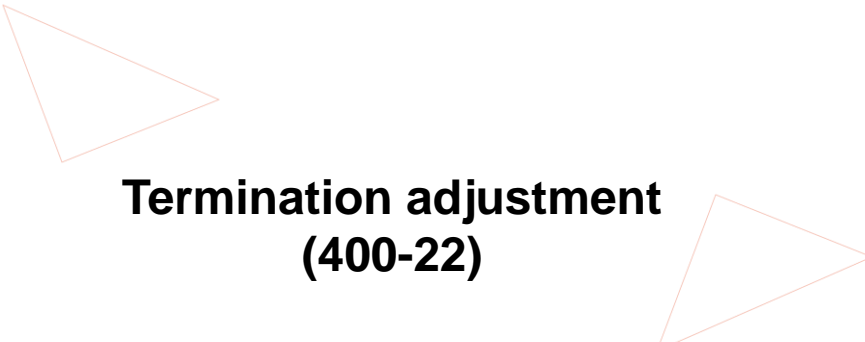

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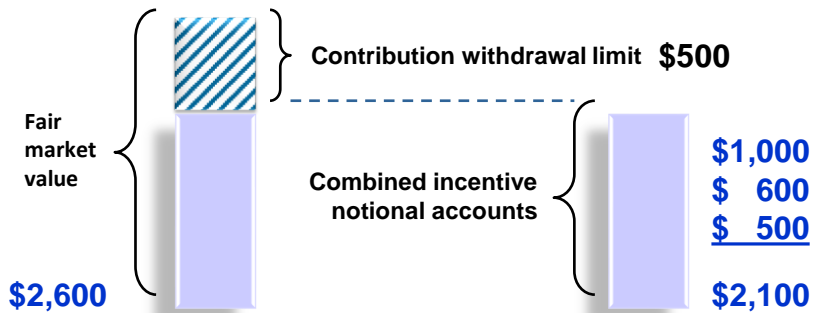


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The fair market value test

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Common problems with a 400-22 transaction

- **Used incorrectly to reconcile accounting errors**
 - Should use only on termination to report incentive amounts that cannot be repaid due to losses



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
